Utilising our Website

Did you know you can contact us through our website?

Scroll down on our home page, or simply click the <u>'Contact Us'</u> icon at the top of the page to get in touch regarding either an admin, or medical query. This saves you having to ring the practice, we will then review your query and contact you to provide the best way forward. You can even attach photographs when discussing a medical issue to help us better understand the action you require.

This is such a useful tool for those who have a laptop, computer or smart phone.

Who Do I See?

Are you never quite sure who you need to speak for your medical issue? A lot of problems do not actually need to be seen by a GP, and can be handled by our other medical professionals such as our Pharmacy Team or Practice Nurse. Although we get into a habit of asking to see our GP Doctor, this isn't always necessary and being seen by the appropriate staff member can help us fight delays due to appointment availability. Go to our website home page and click 'Who Do I Ask To See' to find out who is the best medical professional for you to ask for when booking an appointment. Our reception team are also trained to ask relevant questions about your condition in order to book you in with the most appropriate clinician.

Do not forget to like and follow us on <u>Facebook</u> to keep up to date with all goings on within the practice, as well as local events which may be useful to you!

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Mounjaro Prescribing

We kindly ask that you do not contact the practice specifically to request Mounjaro.

To qualify for Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) for weight loss, patients must meet the following criteria, based on current guidance:

- Over 18 years of age.
- Body Mass Index (BMI) of 40 or greater. Calculate you BMI with the NHS BMI Tool.
- Confirmed diagnosis of at least four of the following five co-morbidities
- Diagnosed Hypertension
- Diagnosed Sleep Apnoea
- Diagnosed Type 2 Diabetes
- Diagnosed Cardiovascular Disease
- Diagnosed Hypercholesterolemia.

If you do not meet a BMI of 40 or above AND at least four of the five conditions, your GP with not be able to prescribe Mounjaro for weight loss.

In the meantime, if you are looking for support with weight management or diabetes, please speak to our team about alternative services that may be available to you.

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Vaccinations

Flu and Covid

Flu and Covid vaccination campaigns start 1st October 2025. If you are eligible, you will be contacted by a member of our team and asked to book in. For the time being, this is for all 75 years old and over, and 18-74 immunosuppressed patients. HPV

The HPV Vaccine is now available for girls under the age of 25, and boys born after 1st September 2006, who missed having the vaccine at school. Please note if you or your child are eligible for the vaccine, you will be contacted by a member of our team to book in. Children aged 12 to 13 (Year 8) can still expect to get the vaccination at school. You can find more information about the HPV Vaccine here or visit the NHS website.







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Cervical Screening Changes

From the 1st of July 2025, anyone who has a Cervical Screening Test on or after this date, and tests negative for HPV will be recalled in 5 years, as apposed to 3 years. This only applies to those aged between 24 and 49 yrs as after this age the recall remains 5 yrs as previous schedule.

From September, NHS plans to start sending results from the NHS Cervical Screening Programme, utilising the NHS App.

In September, those who have a negative test result will be notified of this by an NHS App message. It will also appear as an NHS App notification. If the NHS App message isn't read within 72 hours, a letter will be sent as a failsafe.

Abnormal result letters will continue for the time being to be delivered by post.

Women's Health Hub

We are pleased to confirm that as part of the pilot initiative for the remainder of the year (until 31st March 2026) we will commence the WHH clinics from September.

Appointments will be on Thursday's and Fridays. Appointments will be put on one month in advance, this can be opened up in the week leading up to the appointment only if not filled.

Implants can be fitted on a Thursday and Coils on a Friday.

Coils will need to be prescribed by your own practice and brought to your appointment.

All appointments for the above procedures will be done at Birchwood Medical Practice





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
PCN Acute Hub

We are excited to be a part of the **PCN Acute Hub, based at Birchwood Medical Practice**, as part of a national pilot program aimed at improving access to urgent care within Apex PCN where Boultham Park Medical Practice is part of.

Staffed by experienced Advanced Nurse Practitioners (ANPs) and Advanced Clinical Practitioners (ACPs), the hub offers same-day appointments for patients with acute but non-life-threatening health concerns, ensuring they receive the appropriate care.

To ensure patients receive the most appropriate care, the reception team will assess whether pharmacy services can meet your needs as the first port of call. If suitable, you will be referred to a pharmacy for expert advice and treatment. For those requiring further clinical support, the reception team will refer patients to the Acute Hub. We are actively working to improve this process to enhance access and efficiency across the practice.

If you think you might need support from the hub, please speak to your surgery's reception team for guidance on accessing this service.

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Polite reminders

Please read below our polite reminders to help our surgery run as smoothly and efficiently as we can. We appreciate all of our patients understanding and patience.

- When ordering prescriptions, please give at least 4 working days before picking up from your pharmacy. Unfortunately these are not sent over instantly and ordering is a multistep process. You must order within plenty of time to ensure you do not run out of your medication. Our pharmacy team are struggling to contact local pharmacies due to the volume of patients calling their pharmacy and asking if they prescription is ready. This could be avoided be ordering within plenty of time, and giving at least 4 working days before going to pick up your prescription.
- Please can we remind patients to not use the Boultham Park Medical Practice car park unless they have an appointment or are visiting the surgery. We often run Saturday clinics and it can be incredibly hard for patients to get to the surgery when the car park is full.
- ❖ We would like to remind patients to regularly **check that your contact details are up to date**, so that we are able to get hold of you when necessary. Incorrect contact details can cause delays and may mean we cannot get the information to you that we need. Your details can be updated through the NHS App or <u>website</u>. Alternatively, you can contact our reception team to check your details are up to date.
