LOCATION

Boultham Park Medical Practice is located in the southern part of the city of Lincoln. It enjoys good car parking facilities and is reasonably easily accessible from the Lincoln bypass and other main routes. There is a local bus service, a parade of shops including a local pharmacy, chemist, police station, local schools and churches. It is a relatively self-sufficient area but has easy access to the city centre and the major retail facilities. There are areas within the Practice boundary with high levels of deprivation compared to other Lincoln based practices.

BRIEF HISTORY

Boultham Park Medical Practice has been established many years with a surgery on the present site since the 1960s. The building was extended into what is now its current form in 1999 and then again in 2010 when two further consulting rooms were added when the Practice become a Training Practice.

There are currently 4 Partners in the Practice, 3 of whom are GPs and one of whom is a Clinical Pharmacist. The previous senior partner retired from the partnership in Dec 24 after 30+years at the Practice. He still works at the Practice in a Clinical Governance role and his continued presence provides continuity and experience as the new partners and new Lead partners establish themselves in their new roles.

PREMISES

The property owning partners have recently (February 2025) sold the Practice premises to the Lincolnshire Coop and the new Practice Partnership now has a 15 year leaseback on the premises.

The premises are large and purpose built. Over the years it has played host to a number of community staff and currently hosts and our local midwife and a fortnightly out-patient SPOT clinic run by ULHT Dermatology department. The building is on two floors with medical secretaries, administration and the practice manager being situated on the first floor which also boasts a large meeting room, 2 further treatment room, staff facilities and storage space.

This partnership worked hard to improve the premises by a process of continuous

improvement and investments. Recent internal modifications include the modification of admin rooms into clinical rooms to provide more clinical space and the main reception office has recently been extended to provide more room/desks. The most recent of which has been the conversion of 2 rooms into additional treatment rooms and additional consulting rooms on the first floor.

In total, the Practice's clinical configuration is as follows: Downstairs: 9 x GP consulting rooms, 3 x nurse treatment/consulting rooms, 2 x healthcare assistant rooms and; Upstairs 2 x multipurpose clinical rooms.

We are currently (Jul 25) investigating the conversion of 2 upstairs admin rooms into clinical rooms in order to increase clinical and training capacity.

Patient access is excellent with double automatic doors leading to a dry area for pushchairs, buggies and disabled scooters. A second set of double automatic doors open into the waiting area. Additional to the reception desk is an automated touchscreen system for patients self-check-in. Patients are called into clinics via two Jayex boards prompting them to the relevant surgery or in person by the clinician. A separate waiting area/play area for children is also available; albeit since Covid this has become an extension of the main waiting area. Toilet facilities for both able and disabled patients are easily accessed and private baby changing facilities are provided also. The practice remains committed to a programme of continual investment in the premises.

The consulting and treatment rooms are well equipped allowing Dr Jackson to perform minor surgery along with the general procedures expected of a busy city practice.

Patient records previously located in the reception area were moved to remote storage through a central contract between Lincolnshire now ICB and NEC. This enabled the recent extension of the main reception office. The receptionists have use of a telephone system, clinical IT systems and office furniture such a central networked photocopier/scanner.

She joined the Boultham Park team in 2023 for 5 sessions. Yuen also leads the pharmacy team in the PCN, co-chair of the Connected Culture Leadership forum that focuses on EDI (Equality, Diversity and Inclusion). Yuen leads on education for pharmacy students, foundation trainees (previously known as pre-registration students), teaches in universities and IMG (International Medical Graduates). Marc graduated from the graduate-entry medicine and surgery course at the University of

Marc now works as a full-time GP Partner. Marc now leads on education for medical students and is the Practice Clinical Supervisor for trainees. He has re-commenced the Practice's involvement in clinical research (9 sessions)
